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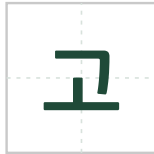
# How the Grid Works

원고지

Every Korean syllable fits inside one square. The faint cross shows where each letter sits.



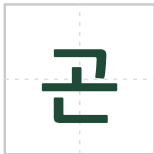
C + V, side by side  
consonant left,  
vowel right



C + V, stacked  
consonant top,  
vowel below



C + V + final C  
batchim sits  
at the bottom



Stacked + final C  
stacked, batchim  
at the bottom



C + double vowel  
two vowels  
combine into one



Double batchim  
rare —  
don't worry yet

## FROM ROK

Don't aim for perfect squares on day one. Aim for balanced squares — letters sharing the space evenly. That's what makes handwriting look Korean.

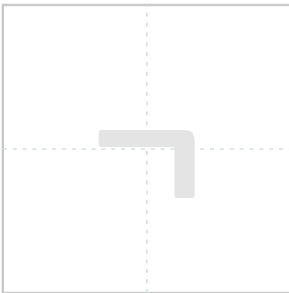

1 STROKE

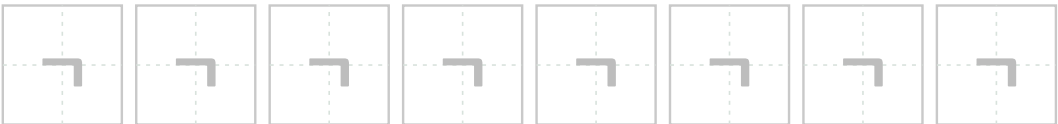
## Sounds like g / k

as in go — or kite at the end of a word

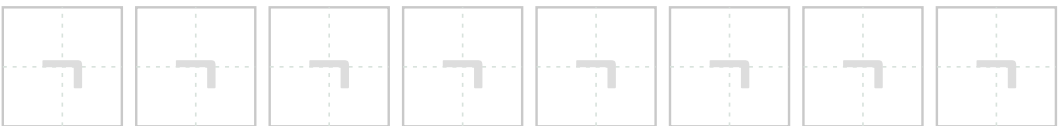
How to write it: across, then down — one bending stroke.

You'll meet it in: 감사합니다 (gamsahamnida — thank you)

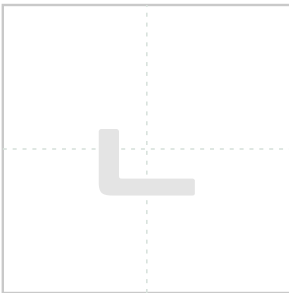

1 STROKE

## Sounds like n

as in no

How to write it: down, then across — one bending stroke.

You'll meet it in: 네 (ne — yes)

# The Twins

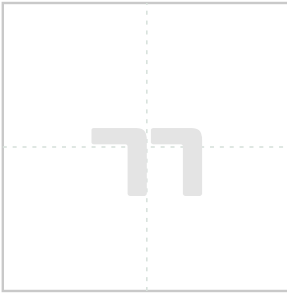

# The letter ㄱ

쌍기역 · ssanggiyeok



2 STROKES

## Tense ㄱ

a tighter, held g — no puff of air

How to write it: write ㄱ twice, side by side, slightly narrow.

You'll meet it in: 꿈 (kkum — dream)

# The Vowels

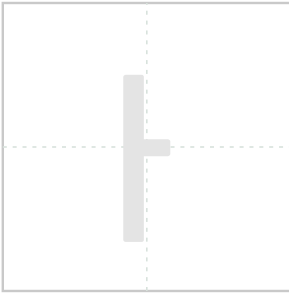
모음

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10 basic vowels · always written with ◯ when they stand alone

# The letter ㅏ

아 · a



2 STROKES

## Sounds like a

ah — as in father

How to write it: long stroke down, then a short arm to the right.

You'll meet it in: 사랑 (sarang — love)

In a syllable, this vowel sits to the RIGHT of the consonant.

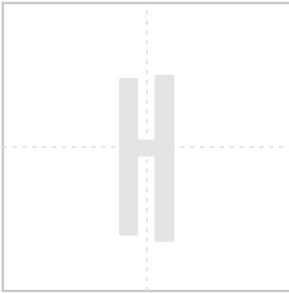
## 이중모음

# The letter ㅐ

애 · ae



3 STROKES

## Sounds like ae

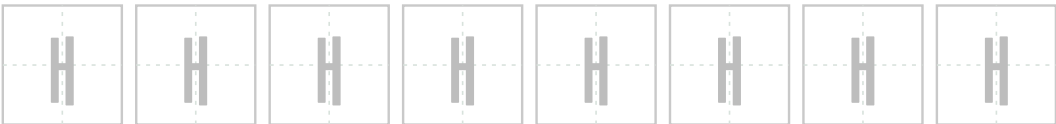
eh — as in bed

How to write it: ㅏ first, then close it with ㅣ.

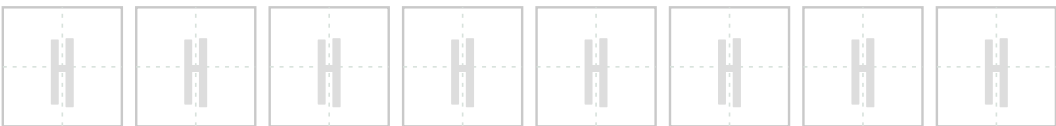
You'll meet it in: 노래 (noraе — song)

In a syllable, this vowel sits to the RIGHT of the consonant.
